ZIMBABWE: BLIND MAN FROM MONICALAND

Ministering to the blind community, had been appealing for help to reach children of the blind. As they received the gifts of OCC, God helped them in Monicaland (there was no church in that area...only cows). As they went with the gifts, when they gave the gifts some people would cry receiving gifts for the first time and they were impressed that someone was thinking of them. Parents would rejoice knowing their kids were receiving gifts for the first time. From that distribution a church was born. They built a building with 600 seats. The people were the ones to build the church plastering, ordered bricks, ..they did nearly everything. Now over 1000 membership, started 3 years

ago. That church is producing offspring, assemblies, around. They're evangelizing, going from place to place. OCC helped lay the foundation and so the foundation is still having an influence. They started an orphanage, which they say is a product of the OCC. They gave gifts to orphans. Those children were so touched – they started praying and thanking Jesus. They started a home for those children and now have 20 of them.

REPORT FROM THE MISSIONS TRIP TO: SOUTH DAKOTA

Lily Adamo, Jennifer Miller, Jonathan Miller, Dan Minehan, Rosa Minehan, and Hannah Pankhurst went to the Pine Ridge Reservation in Porcupine, South Dakota (about 1 hr. from Rapid City) to work with the Lakota people. They were blessed by being a part of the Chuku Waste Ranch, which has been run by Matthew and Amanda Hadden for the past 11 years. They are originally from Georgia but felt the Lord calling them to this region. Their goal is to provide a safe place for the Lakota people, build relationships, meet the needs of the community, while being a spiritual lighthouse. They started receiving assistance for their Wellness Center and Kidney dialysis office from the North American Mission Board in 2019. We support their efforts through the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering each year! During the week that the mission team was there, we helped with several camp maintenance projects, completed the renovation of a home for a family, cleaned the church, and delivered lunches for the dialysis patients. We were really blessed to be present when the keys were turned over to this family. We prayed with them, worshiped, and praised God for his provision! The Ranch also hosts summer camp and bus children in each day. Our efforts as part of the construction team, is considered a 'compassion ministry', performing tasks behind the scenes to continue building the trust of the community, build relationships, and show the love of Jesus through a servant's heart.
