Welcome to another Christmas season! As usual in our increasingly pagan culture. Christmas will continue to be under attack this year: not only the true meaning of Christmas but even the name "Christmas" itself! While I do not appreciate replacing the word "Christmas" with "Winter" or "Sparkle," I do not mind calling the Christmas season, "The holidays," There are two reasons why "the holidays" are acceptable to me: the first reason is that the word "holidays" comes from two English words: "holy" and "days." By calling the Christmas season, "holidays," people are acknowledging the spiritual nature of the days.

The second reason I don't mind using "holidays" is there are several holidays during the Christmas season: Thanksgiving, Hanukkah, Christmas, New Years, and Pastor Gary's birthday (December 28th). OFFENDED BY CHRISTMAS CONTINUED

What about using "Xmas" for Christmas? Isn't that just another way to cancel the name of Christmas? Not exactly. You see, early believers abbreviated "Christ" as "X", since "X" is the first letter of "Christ" in Greek. For those who know that, "Xmas" is simple shorthand; however, for those who don't know that, "Xmas" is another way to keep Christ out of Christmas. Since most people don't know about early Christians and the Greek language, "Xmas" should be avoided.

The word "Christmas" comes from two English words: "Christ" and "mass." "Christ" is the Greek equivalent of the Hebrew word, "Messiah." "Mass" means "celebration"; so Christmas is a celebration of Christ. The Christmas season—and especially Christmas day—should be a celebration of Jesus: Who He is, why He came, what He did, where He is now, and that He is coming back.

Who is Jesus? Jesus is God incarnate, God in the flesh. Matthew 1:23 informs that Jesus is Emmanuel, God with us. Why did Jesus come? Jesus came to save us from our sins as Matthew 1:21 declares. What did Jesus do? Jesus' ministry included teaching, performing miracles, dying for our sins, and rising from the dead. Where is Jesus now? Since His ascension into heaven, Jesus is now seated on the right hand of God, The Father (Mark 16:19). Jesus promised to return to His birthplace, Earth. When He will return is unknown to us but is now closer than it ever has been before! Jesus came once: this is history; Jesus will come again: when is a mystery. Jesus' first appearance changed history; His second appearance will conclude history. The main advice that Jesus left us concerning His return is to be ready. You may not be ready to celebrate Christmas yet, but you can be ready for Jesus to return. The only way to be ready for His return is to receive Him now as Savior and Lord by grace through faith.




