

Newsletter... ("Back in the Day")

As I look at the cover of the newsletter "The Lamplighter", can't help but appreciate how attractive the banner looks now that it's printed in color.

From 1974-1975, I served as the church secretary. There was no space in the church for an office, so I worked from my home. The most challenging part of my job was the production of "The Lamplighter." The pastor would bring me the information for the newsletter, and I would get started.

I started with a stencil. To get the banner at the top, you used a razor blade and cut out a section of the stencil just the right size for the banner. The "banner" was a separate item of stencil material that was glued to the master stencil. The opening tat you cut had to be precise. You sued a particular glue to join the banner strip to the stencil., If your cutout section was too large, you risked having a black smudge that was so obvious. Be too skimpy with the glue and it would separate from the stencil and then you would have a real problem. These problems occurred at one time or another during my tenure as church secretary.

Next came the typing on a manual Royal typewriter. Make a typo and you sued a liquid filler, wait for it to dry, and make the correction. Now it was time to duplicate the newsletter. The stencil was attached to a large, electric mimeograph machine. It has a "drum" that was inked with black ink. Under inked, it would produce a copy of uneven print. Over inked, you had the possibility of a messy outcome, i.e. black hands, spotted clothes and a messy work area!!!!

This is a typical "back in the day" recollection. At my age and memory challenges, it's somewhat of a miracle that I could recall it!!!!

Everything OCC

At some point, you've likely heard life being described as a race. In fact, the Bible compares it to a race numerous time, though the race is not so much a sprint as a marathon. We have all been called to run, and we are encouraged to run well. The question must be asked then about our spiritual lives: Are we ready? Have you prepared well for your race? Was there a moment when you confessed your sins to God and accepted Christ as your personal Savior? That's the first step! Then look to the Word of God as the ultimate guide to prepare you for your own unique spiritual race. God also has rules for His people. In Exodus 20, God gives Moses the "rules" for Godly living: The Ten Commandments. In the New Testament, Jesus was asked what the greatest commandment was, and He responded, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37-39). Jesus made the most important rule for believers very clear: Love God and love others! Let's not complicate that. Our Heavenly Father wants to reward you too. But His rewards are far better than any of these earthly rewards that we collect. The Bible reminds us that material rewards and possessions will rust and decay, but our spiritual rewards will last forever (Matthew 6:19-21). God's race for our lives is not one that requires striving out of our own strength to keep up and hoping to achieve a prize. As we keep our eyes on Him and fill our hearts with His Word, He will surely guide our steps and remind us of what is most important. And we'll find that His rewards are worth more than anything the world could offer.

Tanzania-

Tanzania is an East African country that features Africa's highest mountain, Kilimanjaro, at more than 19,000 feet. The country has over 100 indigenous people groups and two official languages, Swahili and English. Samaritan's Purse began distributing gift-filled shoeboxes there in 2001 and launched The Greatest Journey, our follow-up discipleship program, in this nation in 2011.

Lesotho-
