Does anything stand out to you that you have a talent for or may enjoy doing? Maybe you see a need that is not on this list. Please talk to Heather Guiffre about your talent or desire. She will be available to help you beginning June 9th.

Adult Social Committee: Chairperson is Jennifer Miller. <u>They are seeking 1-2 persons that would help plan 2 church events per year for the adult members.</u> Past examples of events include the Valentine's Dinner at FBC, Sight and Sound Theatre trips and comedy shows.

Association Representative: This consists of 2 members from our church who attend the annual Potomac Baptist Association meeting in the fall and vote on behalf of FBCLP.

Audio Visual Committee: Chairperson is Chuck Bonn. The team is responsible for setting up the equipment when needed (mainly microphones), running the sound system, playing videos and streaming the live stream. They help with choir practice and edify practice. They also help with funerals, weddings and graduations.

Audit Committee: Chairperson is Dawn Adamo. The goal is to audit the church's financial and property records annually within 90 days of the close of each fiscal year. The members cannot consist of any person handling church finances. This includes, but is not limited to the treasurer, asst. treasurer, financial secretary, or tellers.

AWANA: Chairperson is Julie Burgess. There are also directors and leaders. Directors are the heads of each club and they plan the weekly lesson for the their group. The leaders are responsible for listening to the clubbers verses, helping to maintain records and helping with game times & activities.

Brotherhood: Chairperson is Dean Irwin. This is a panel of men that meet regularly to discuss

ptay areas for the chitdren, etc.

Child Protection Committee: Responsible for providing an environment which is as safe and secure as possible for children and youth who attend the church or any church-sponsored programs or activities, and take the necessary precautions to protect church leaders from accusations or suspicions. *They are in need of someone from the VBS Committee to join and represent that ministry.*

Children's Social Committee: Assists the church by providing spiritual, social, physical and educational activities for the children of our church. <u>They are seeking 1-2 persons</u> that would help plan 2 church events per year for the children of our church.

Children's Worship: Chairperson is Carolyn Shaffer. This group has Teachers and Youth Helpers. This ministry teaches children about our Lord and Savior, which can help them feel loved and included. It also teaches children to have faith and follow Christ's teachings. It can encourage parents to attend church more faithfully, and can help new families connect with the church. *They are in need of more teachers*.

Church Clerk: Primary is Jeni Irwin, Assistant is Sheri Bresnahan. Duties include, but are not limited to attending business meetings, preparing the minutes, and processing church members in and out of the church.

Church Council: This committee is composed of the church ministerial staff, treasurer, Chairman of the Deacons, the director of each church organization (Sunday School, Music, WMU and Brotherhood) and 2 adult members from the congregation at large. The council plans, coordinates and publishes a calendar of church activities for the church year.

Church Historian: Rosa Minehan. The historian gathers, preserves, and stores important historical records and photos.

Church Moderator: Ken Doyle. Responsible for calling meetings to order, overseeing debates and allowing resolutions to be put to the church house for voting. He maintains order and harmony with church matters. Chairman of Deacons or Pastor may fill in church moderator's absence.

Communion Host/Hostess: Duties include preparation and clean up of the communion elements before church services that fall on the 5th Sunday of a month (typically once per quarter). Also, keeping up with and ordering supplies.

Facilities Use: Chairperson is Patrick Hancock. Purpose is to oversee the use of the church, its cleanliness, and scheduling of events/meetings on campus.

Fellowship Committee: Chairperson is Courtney Harbin. Their purpose is to assist the church in promoting church-wide fellowship, coordinate all church-wide activities that require food preparation (including repasts) and oversee proper care and maintenance

procedures for receiving, counting, safeguarding, and disbursing funds are followed. Corrections, additions to and monitoring of church budgets is also a priority.

Finance Officers: Treasurer: Terry Mathews, Assistant Treasurer: Sheri Bresnahan, Financial Secretary: Jessica Hathcock

Flower Committee: Chairperson is Debbie Schneider. The committee is responsible for decorating the sanctuary and other areas of the church for special occasions. They are also responsible for the Hanging of the Greens ceremony near Christmastime.

Homeschool Umbrella Group: Chairperson Jill Hancock. This is an all-volunteer group, primarily of current and former home educating families. They are authorized to supervise home instruction.

Ladies Bible Study. Ladies of the Light Leader: Carolyn Shaffer. Meetings are every Tuesday morning. The purpose of the group is to help women grow spiritually, connect with other women, and become more engaged in the church

Library Committee: This group is responsible for receiving, recording, and cataloging all materials that are to be placed in the library. The committee shall select temporary volunteer help as needed.

Music Committee: They are comprised mostly of the music leadership and cover all of the music ministry in the church—choirs, instrumentalists, or other groups. They are often joined by someone in the technology committee in order to discuss/check the sound system.

Music Ministry: Director is Ken Doyle. The responsibility of this ministry is to provide worshipful music for all services and departments of the church. The adult choir, Pastor, and other leaders work together selecting suitable music and they will devise appropriate musical programs for all occasions when needed.

Nominating Committee: Chairperson is Heather Guiffre. The Nominating Committee fills positions of service for all committees for the church calendar year. Duties include speaking with church members about where they feel led to serve, meeting to discuss and finalize reports for next calendar year (September). Also report at May's business meeting for church council nominations and again in August to finalize report changes. They are currently in need of a secretary to attend meetings and prepare minutes.

Nursery: Coordinator is Jill Hancock. <u>They are in need of someone to take over as coordinator</u>. This job entails volunteer scheduling, cleaning/disinfecting toys, and ordering supplies. They are also in need of helpers to manage the check-in stations for children going into Sunday School, Nursery or Children's Church.

Outreach: Leader is Dean Irwin. The purpose is to reach the lost by assessing

need with a roof over their heads and a warm place to sleep each night from late fall through spring. In the past, FBC has sponsored one week of lodging/meals and collected donations of items and money to help the program.

Safety & Security: Chairperson is Logan Irwin. This team is responsible for the development and implementation of safety policies within the church. Volunteers are needed to serve as door monitors before and during services to monitor

Sunday School: Director is Kevin Guiffre. <u>They are searching for friendly and reliable Christians to join their Sunday School team</u>. If you're a motivated and creative professional with a talent for teaching, then they are interested in you! In this position, you will be responsible for developing lesson plans, responding to issues, addressing students' needs, and being available to attend any meetings. As a Sunday school teacher, you will demonstrate Bible knowledge and teaching abilities. You must be a church member, with excellent communication and interpersonal skills.

Technology Committee: Chairperson is Ken Doyle. This committee monitors, and maintains the equipment, software and infrastructure required to advance the goals and the activities of the church. They are available to assist and advise in implementing solutions to tech-related problems.

Tellers: Chairperson is Sharon Bruce. Tellers are responsible for counting offerings, record keeping and making bank deposits, all while maintaining confidentiality. The time commitment is one month per quarter for 1 hour after each Sunday service during that month. *Volunteers are always needed*.

Trustee: Chairperson is Bob Mathews. Members of this group act as the legal representatives of the church and have the authority to buy, sell, mortgage, lease or transfer any property subject to church approval. They also hold and ensure the security of legal documents, such as mortgages, deeds, and insurance policies.

UPWARD Sports: Coordinator is Shannon Pankhurst. The goal is to promote the discovery of Jesus through sports. <u>They are in need of volunteers to help with some of the game day or practice load. Do you have creative & fresh ideas to bring in new families or minister to the ones we currently have?</u>

Ushers: Chairperson is Dean Irwin. Ushers greet and direct members and visitors, assist with seating, collect offerings, assist those in need, provide information about the church, etc. Commitment time is every other month for 4 weeks straight.

From the time that we are young, something within each of us longs for a father.





IMB (International Mission Board) has identified 3,072 people groups that have remained unengaged—until now. Through Project 3000, our missionaries are working to find these people groups and cultivate gospel access so they can begin to know about Jesus.

Our IMB missionaries, in collaboration with local partners, continue the vital work of gospel engagement. Through discipleship, church planting, and nurturing the growth of mature believers, we aspire to see these people groups brought to Jesus Christ.

June Estes, a missionary explorer, actively seeks out and researches people groups living in the far corners of the world so we can know how to best reach them with the gospel.

June spends her days trekking around the world sharing the name of Jesus Christ with those who have never heard it before.
